PROGRAMS


Our picnic will start at 11 am; bring your own lunch.

JUNE 19 - A SLICE OF FUN TABLE RUNNER PROJECT

Bring the following Supplies:

28 strips of fabric in your color choice measuring 1 1/2", 2", or 2 1/2" widths by 6" to 14" length, (You want a variety of widths and lengths)

Color suggestions: Yellows for lemon, Greens for limes, Oranges for orange, or Red for watermelon

- 1/4 yard white fabric-cut bias strips 1 3/4" widths
- 1/4 yard green fabric-cut bias strips 1 1/2" widths
- 1/2 yard backing fabric
- 1/2 yard of fusible fleece
- thread to match your color choice front and bobbin thread to match your color choice on back
- white thread
- machine and basic sewing supplies

This is a quilt as you go project!

HCQG MYSTERY QUILT 2023

Welcome to the June installment of our Mystery Quilt. Last month we did a little cutting and a little sewing and will be doing more of the same this month. Each month we will get closer to solving our Mystery. Hopefully, showing my fabric selections at the Guild meeting has helped those who were unsure about their fabrics.

If you haven't started yet, don't worry, there's still time to join in! Each month the instructions are published in the Newsletter. This is only the 2nd installment of the mystery so there's plenty of time to catch up!!!

SECOND CLUE -

<u>CUTTING</u> -

From Fabric A - Cut 4 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Subcut strips into 34 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.

- Label 34 rectangles Block A-4.
- Cut 5 strips 2 ½" x WOF. Subcut strips into 68 2 ½" squares and put them in with Block A-4.
- Cut 3 strips 2 ½" x WOF. Subcut strips into 48 2 ½" squares. Label them Block B-1.
- From Fabric B Cut 6 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Subcut strips into 34 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" rectangles and label them Block A-5.
 - Cut 3 strips 2 ½" x WOF. Subcut strips into 34 2 ½" squares and put them with Block A-5.

<u>SEWING</u>-

Same as we did last month except with Fabric D.

From Block A-2 draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric D - $1 \frac{1}{2}$ "x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Place the square, right sides together at a corner of Fabric A – $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. Sew on the drawn line. Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle.




Put together 2 units as shown below for a total of 68 units.



Label these units as A-2 and put aside until later.

Let's make some Magic 8 Half Square Triangles. If you were at the Project Day in April, you learned how to make the Magic 8 HST's for the Eagle Ranch project. If you weren't in attendance, no worries. They are super easy.



Take 5 of the Fabric A squares and the 5 Fabric C squares from the Block A-3 label. Put them right sides together. Mark two diagonal lines on the wrong side of your top fabric as shown in Fig 1. Then sew a scant ¼" on either side of the line as shown in Fig 2.

Once all your lines are sewn, use your rotary cutter to cut vertical and horizontal lines as shown in Fig 3. Then you can cut the diagonal lines as shown in Fig 4. At this point you can trim your HST's to the correct size and then press them open or press them open and then trim your HST's. It will depend on the ruler you like to use. Either way you decide, press your seams open.

Repeat the process with the last 5 Fabric A squares and the 5 Fabric D squares from the Block A-3 label. Once completed with all your HST's, place them back in the Block A-3 label.

Ok! That's it for this month! Can't wait to see your progress!
