"FREE MOTION REVERSE APPLIQUE" WORKSHOP – TUESDAY, MARCH 5 – 9 am till 1 pm

This workshop will be led by Kay, from Sew Sew Studio in Bogart, GA. The cost is \$55.00, which includes the kit with all fabrics and use of templates for the designs. PLEASE BE PREPARED TO PAY AT THE FEBRUARY GUILD MEETING. CHECKS SHOULD BE MADE OUT TO HCQG. Sign up for the workshop will be available at this meeting if you did not do so in January.

You'll need to bring your own machine, power cord, foot pedal, extension cord or power strip if you have one. Bring the free motion foot for your machine, and other usual sewing accessories, thread, etc. Kay suggests small snips/scissors with sharp pointy tips for cutting away the fabric. You will need a WATER SOLUBLE OR HEAT ERASABLE MARKER for tracing the pattern onto the black fabric, so a lighter color works best. The shop will have a few extra supplies in case someone needs to purchase.

Hope you will sign up and join us for this "out of our box" experience!




Just a friendly reminder our dues of \$50.00 will be due in March for our 2024-2025 year.
